Dear Parents/Carers,

In last week's bulletin, I commented on how wonderful the children looked in their Children in Need outfits. Once again, thankyou for your very kind donations; the money has now been counted and collectively we managed to raise £200, a fantastic amount! The money will now be forwarded onto Children in Need.

There have been a number of exciting activities happening in classrooms this week. The year 6 children enjoyed a very realistic World War II evacuation day (and looked amazing in their 1940s inspired clothing!) and the year 3 children have enjoyed beginning to look at healthy eating as part of their DT work.

Speaking of healthy eating, may I also take this opportunity to respectfully ask that packed lunches sent into school from home are healthy and balanced. The most important consideration is that they are balanced and contain healthy options. A packet of crisps is absolutely fine, as is a chocolate biscuit, as long as the main item in the lunch is healthy. We ask that sweets are not sent into school as part of a packed lunch. And please remember that we are a nut free environment. We appreciate your support around this.

As part of our Covid risk assessment, we de-commissioned the water coolers in school at the beginning of this academic year; clearly though, it is essential that children drink water through the day and remain hydrated. With this in mind, may I also ask that all children come into school, every day, with a full water bottle, these can then be refilled from the drinking water taps in the rest rooms which are cleaned and sanitised hourly.

The temperature has certainly dropped over these last few days and so it is even more essential that children now come into school with a warm, waterproof coat. As mentioned in previous communication, we are keeping windows in classrooms open, as well as other doors and although the central heating is on, it is still cooler than usual in the school building. Children are able to wear outer clothing in school if they feel cold. We feel this is the best way to minimise risk within the classrooms. Equally, we are taking the children outside even if it is a little drizzly. It is imperative therefore that children come into school in appropriate clothing for this time of year.

Finally, please continue to inform the school immediately if any member of your household develops symptoms, receives a positive test result or is self-isolating. It is very important that any pupil who has been in close contact with someone who has tested positive self isolates for 14 days. 
