



Dear Parents and Carers,

As I mentioned in the letter sent earlier this week, we are really looking forward to welcoming all of the children back into school on the 8th March. We are working through a revised risk assessment at the moment, but the main features of the provision in place before the Christmas break will resume. DfE guidance is still very clear that we must do all we can to minimise risk and maximise safety, so enhanced cleaning, increased ventilation, bubble separation and so on will all have to continue. This means that the staggered start and end times, together with multiple entrances/exits will also continue. I will send you all a more detailed letter next week with all the necessary information. Wraparound provision will continue, so if you need to use this service, please contact school to register in the normal manner.

As we end the first week back after the half term break, it has been lovely to see the effort the children are continuing to put into their work, both at home and in school. I am really pleased that the move to using the Assignment tool on Microsoft Teams has gone smoothly. Please do get in touch though if you are experiencing any problems.

Unfortunately, we won't be able to welcome you all into school just yet, but we will still hold a parents' meeting for you to discuss your child/ren's education.
