Dear Parents and Carers,

It's the end of another week and we find ourselves one week closer to Christmas. We have counted the donations for last week's Children in Need non-uniform day and we raised an impressive £204.92! Many thanks for supporting this worthwhile cause.

We have decided the focus for our school fundraising this year will be to develop our outdoor learning area and pond and to continue to improve our supply of books for the children to take home. All fundraising for the school fund will go towards these projects. The pupil parliament are going to name the two charities that we will raise money for at our coffee mornings that are planned in for later in the year this week.

Attendance

School gives your child a wide range of experiences in the form of academic lessons, educational trips and clubs. It's no secret that the more your child is in school the more they increase their opportunity to fulfil their potential. School can also help your child's social skills, such as making and keeping friendships. A regular and punctual attendance pattern will help your child when they enter the world of work.

Whilst we obviously recognise that children do get poorly and that there are times when they will be too sick to attend school, here at Westdale Junior School, we have an ambitious target of 98% for children's attendance. We consider a child's attendance a cause for concern if it drops below 95%. When attendance falls below 90%, a child is considered to be a "persistent absentee". But what does this look like in terms of days? In order for a child to have an attendance of 98%, they would only be off school for 4 days over the course of the academic year. 95% equates to 9 days off. A child would be considered to be a "persistent absentee" if they were to have 19 days off over the course of the year. We track attendance on a weekly basis and the whole-school attendance figure for last week was 93.71%, which is quite some way below our target. The year group with the best attendance at 97.22% was Year 5 and the individual class with the best attendance at 99.12% was 3LM. Congratulations to them!

Plans are coming together for the festive season and today I am going to fill you in on arrangements for Christmas Jumper Day, the Christmas Carol Concert and the Christmas Food Bank collection. I am also planning to finalise details of Christmas Parties this week. I will let you know about these in next week's letter.
