Looking ahead to this term, we will be having a really tight focus on attendance. Last week, I wrote and handed out over 60 certificates for children who celebrated 100% attendance last term. Well done to all of them! Whilst we do recognise that children are ill from time-to-time, and we are also aware that there are a number of illnesses circulating at the moment, good levels of attendance and punctuality are vital to achievement at school and social development. I have written before about Westdale's target of 98% attendance. Good attendance is considered to be above 95% and where a child's attendance drops below 90%, it is viewed as a cause for concern. We will be contacting parents of children whose attendance has fallen below this level to try to ascertain ways of working together to improve their child's attendance. As a school, we are here to listen and support in whatever way we can. If you are experiencing problems with getting your child to school, please do contact me for a discussion.

Another focus this term will be uniform – especially footwear. At the end of last term, we noticed a significant number of children in brightly-coloured trainers, which do not form part of our school uniform. School shoes can be expensive and we are aware that there are many families struggling financially at the moment. Again, if you are struggling to afford uniform for your child, please do get in contact as there may be a way we can support.
