Lesson 1

For art this week, I would like you to write the word 'Hope' in large bubble writing on a piece of plain A4 paper. If you find this difficult, then print it out and use your word processing skills. For the first letter (H) practise using a pencil and shading from dark to light across the letter. For the second letter O, choose your favourite colour and practise shading from dark to light across the letter. Stay in the lines and keep your work neat and clear. For the remaining two letters (P, E), use your colour pencils and add patterns e.g. colour a letter using rainbow colours, create patterns of ever decreasing circles, stripes, add in some flowers or pictures which highlight what the word means e.g. a ray of sunshine.

Then thinks about what gives you hope and happiness. Draw and colour some pictures around the letters e.g. a shooting star, a ray of sunlight, flowers growing in Spring, family, friends, nature a message from friend or a phone call. Use your imagination.

Lesson 2

The second part of the picture is to take a photo of yourself. If you have a fishing net or net you might use on the beach to look in rock pools then use this in your photo. Imagine you are looking for hope using your net. Take a photo. Print this out in black and white. Print the photo so the photo of you isn't bigger than 12cm. This can be cut out and placed onto your background.

For the background, print off a black and white photo of a burnt out forest where everything is bleak and there is little hope. Add the photo of you looking for hope. Draw onto white paper some of the objects, things that make you happy or give you hope. Add colour and sparkle. Cut these out and glue these onto the picture. Share your pictures on SeaSaw.
