• You could share a story together. This could be a chapter book where you read and discuss a chapter a day. • Listen to your child read and let them discuss what they have read. Encourage them to read with expression and intonation. • Following this, ask your child to summarise the events from the chapter. They could bullet point what happened, create a comic strip or present the information in their own creative way. • Encourage your child to note down any unfamiliar words from the chapter they have read. Explore the meanings of these words by using a dictionary or reading around the sentence. • Challenge your child to read something around the house that isn't a book. • Watch Newsround and discuss what is happening in the wider world. • Explore the website below and have a read through an e-book. https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/for-home/find-a-book/library-page This is a brilliant web site and allows access to hundreds of e-books. You just need to register your email and think of a password. It is completely free. You can also access books which work on specific phonics, if needed, to allow the reader to make progress. Science- Rocks and soils

In Spring term, we will be learning about rocks and soils for our science topic.
