BOUGHTON WOODS, NORTHAMPTONSHIRE


Boughton Woods offer large areas of ancient woodland where pupils will become fully immersed in the natural world.

The children will take part in these sorts of activities:

- Fire building,
- shelter building,
- wilderness first aid,
- trap making,
- learning about camouflage and concealment,
- wilderness walk,
- scenario S.O.S.
- evening games,



What sort of activities will the children take part in?

ACTIVITY	DESCRIPTION
Shelter Building	The students will learn why we need shelter when we are living outside and the types of shelter from different societies and nationalities across the ages. Tribes will build their own shelter, using natural woodland materials
Camp Craft	This is a chance for the tribes to develop a tribal identity, making fun tribal flags, dances and songs.
Wilderness First Aid	The students will learn basic skills to cope with a medical emergency in the wild, including how to construct a simple stretcher from the items you have on you, and how to improvise and effective splint.
Pottery/Moulding	Unleash your inner artist! Under the guidance of our brilliant staff, children can let their imagination run wild in the wilderness! Designing and sculpting their work of art around the campfire, they will bring home their wonderful creations at the end of camp.
Cutting Tools	Students will learn about the different tools used in the field of Bushcraft, both primitive and modern, and reasons for their use. They will be taught safe handling techniques and will make their own tent peg
Wilderness Walk	You will go on to an adventure into the woods and learning about the trees and nature surrounding us.
Scenario SOS	The students will put their new skills to the test and work in teams, using navigation to locate a simulated plane-crash scene, where they will treat the casualties and make improvised stretchers to evacuate them back to camp.
Trap Making	The students will be taught why it is important to find food in remote settings, and how this has been achieved over the ages. Our instructors will demonstrate trapping methods, before each tribe designs and builds their own trap.
Bushcraft Challenge	The teams will participate in a series of fun but challenging initiative exercise that will really put them to the test, both mentally and physically. This is a great team-building activity and demands trust and communication.
Camouflage & Concealment	Students will take part in a fun camouflage and concealment exercise, employing team tactics and making the most of their surroundings to camouflage themselves and evade capture.

Where will the children stay?

A Bushcraft camp is made up of a large central yurt where activities start and we have a few meal times. It has a central camp fire and is the heart of the camp. This is surrounded by smaller bell tents which the students sleep in, a camp kitchen area, hydration station and flushing port-a-loos.

On every camp the students will sleep in single sex tent groups, in our large safari-style bell tents. All our bell tents are custom made, with a canvas inner and a waterproof cover, so students will stay warm and dry. Overnight the students will be looked after by our Tribe Leaders, with members of our staff sleeping underneath a central yurt, within 20 paces of the student tents. School teachers will sleep in allocated Teacher Tents, within viewing distance of the students.

All lunch and dinner meals will be hot and they can cater for all dietary requirements, including vegan, vegetarian, halal, gluten free, lactose free and any other requirement, and every camp is a nut free zone.



What will the children need to take with them?

ESSENTIAL ITEMS TO PACK

Large rucksack or holdall (for main luggage)	Small rucksack to carry the essentials
Warm sleeping bag (season 3 is reccomended)	Roll mat
Tracksuit or hardwearing trousers	T-shirts
Jumper or fleece	Waterproof jacket and trousers
Socks and underwear	2 pairs of footwear (eg. walking boots and old trainers)
Wash bag including toothbrush, toothpaste, soap, face wipes	Towel(s)
Medication (labelled with name and clear instructions on application/dosage required)	Water bottles or hydration system
Alcohol hand gel	Torch (with fresh batteries) - a head torch is ideal
Insect repellent	

Please do not feel the need to buy new and expensive items.

Please do pack enough clothes for a fresh change of clothes everyday.

Children will not be allowed to take mobile phones with them.



How much will the trip cost?

Total cost is £250.00 per child paid through iPay. This includes full board, participation in the activities and transport to and from Bushcraft.

Payment Plan:

- Deposit of £50 due Friday 18th October
- Four further instalments of £50 monthly
- Full amount to be paid by 15th February
